## DIRECTIONS.

In the Programme the Courses are referred to as Nos. 1, 2, 3. and 4.

- No. I COURSE is—From starting line at Queen's Wharf, thence to and round Club buoy off Koro Koro, thence to and round buoy off Pinnacle Rock, thence to and across starting line. Yachts must keep on Town side of Soames and Ward Islands. Reverse course in Northerly wind.
- No. 2 COURSE is—From starting line at Queen's Wharf, thence to and round Club buoy off Koro Koro, thence to and round buoy on Hope Shoal off Ward Island, thence to and across starting line. Yachts must keep on Town side of Soames and Ward Islands. Reverse course in Northerly wind.
- No. 3 COURSE is—From starting line at Queen's Wharf, thence to and round Club buoy off Koro Koro, thence to and round buoy off Point Halswell, thence to and across starting line. Yachts must keep on Town side of Soames and Ward Islands. Reverse course in Northerly wind.
- No. 4 COURSE is—From starting line at Queen's Wharf, round outer Rock at Barrett's Reef, and back to starting line.

The Starting and Finishing Line shall be an imaginary line drawn between S.E. corner of Queen's Wharf and Destructor chimney.

Five minutes before the start a Blue Peter shall be hoisted.

After this signal, the yachts in the race shall be amenable to the rules. At the expiration of the five minutes EXACTLY the Blue Peter shall be hauled down and a gun fired as a signal to start.

In a start, if any yacht, or part of her hull, spars, or other equipment be on, or across the starting line before the signal to start is made, her recall flag shall be hoisted, when she must return and recross the line; a yacht so returning, or one working into position from the wrong side of the line after the signal to start has been made, must keep clear of the competing yachts.

Should the gun miss-fire, the lowering of the Blur Peter shall be the signal to start.

For all sailing races in N. winds, the buoys used to mark course are to be kept on Port side, and in S. winds, on the Starboard side of yachts when rounding.

In the event of a shift in the wind, boats will keep the course on which they start.

The sub-Committee in charge for the day shall have power to postpone any race, should unfavourable weather render such a course desirable. Letter N of the Commercial Code, hoisted in a conspicuous place at 10 a.m., shall be the signal that all races have been postponed.

In all races boats to cross finishing line not later than 7 p.m.

All races are subject to rules of the P.N.Y.C. re Starting, Postponements, Protests, &c.: and the classes are as follows: 1st Class, 5 rating and over; 2nd Class,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  rating and under 5; 3rd Class, under  $2\frac{1}{2}$  rating and over 1. All Handleaps are sealed.

For all events two to start or no race; three to start or no second prize; five to start or no third prize. Subject to Rule 28.

The Committee reserve the right to make deductions from the advertised prize money should funds be short.

The Committee reserve to themselves the right to seal ballast, and place fairplay men on all or any yacht.

All protests to be made in accordance with the Club rules, and to be accompanied by the sum of Twenty Shillings, which will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous.
